


Adinkra symbols

	Gye Nyame	Except God. A symbol expressing the omnipotence of God. Probably the most popular Adinkra symbol. It is featured on Ghana's largest-denomination banknote, the 200 cedi note.
	Sankofa	Go back and get it. A symbol of the wisdom of learning from the past to build for the future. From the Akan proverb, "Se wo were fi na wosan kofa a yenkyiri," meaning, "It is not taboo to go back for what you forgot (or left behind)."
	Odo Nnyew Fie Kwan	Love does not lose its way home. Those led by love always end up in the right place.
	Denkyem	Crocodile. A symbol of adaptability and cleverness
	Ananse Ntentan	Spider's web. A symbol of wisdom, craftiness, creativity, and the complexities of life. It is the web of Ananse, the crafty spider who is preeminent in African folklore.
	Bi Nka Bi	No one should bite another. A symbol of justice, fairplay, freedom, peace, forgiveness, unity, harmony, and the avoidance of conflict or strife.

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
